Matilda is named Youth Worker of the Year 2018



Girlguiding Scotland leader, Matilda Lomas from the Isle of Harris, was named Youth Worker of the Year 2018 for her work in empowering girls and young women in a small island community.

Forty-six outstanding youth workers and youth work projects were celebrated with 14 winners crowned and another seven long-serving youth workers inducted to the YouthLink Scotland Lifetime Achievement community. Co-designed with a talented

group of young people, the ceremony celebrated YOYP 2018 and showcased the amazing talents and impact of youth workers on the lives of our young people.

It was incredible seeing the work of so many members of the Awards Network celebrated and recognised at this year's National Youth Work Awards organised by YouthLink Scotland at the Crowne Plaza Glasgow. Overall winner, Matilda, also won the Community Based Youth Work category, sponsored by Youth Scotland. Katie Mackay from the Prince's Trust won the Supporting Attainment Category sponsored by Education Scotland and in the Lifetime Achievement Category Graham Haddock from Scouts Scotland, Janet Lonie from Girlguiding Edinburgh, Alistair Whitelaw from the 1st Lenzie Company, Boy's Brigade and Elizabeth MacDonald from Youth 1st all received recognition.

Youth Scotland reach landmark 50,000th youth award



50,000 young people across Scotland have now received a Dynamic Youth Award, Youth Achievement Award or Hi5 Award.

Youth Scotland first introduced Youth Achievement Awards in 1998, with the first Bronze award being achieved the following year. Youth Achievement Awards are for young people age 14+ and sit at SCQF levels 4 – 7. In 2005 the Dynamic Youth Awards were developed and these are aimed at young people age 10+ and sit at SCQF level 3. The latest addition to the Youth Scotland suite of awards is the Hi5 award which was launched in September 2017. It is particularly suited as an entry level award for primary school age children and sits at SCQF level 2.

Young people have a range of learning styles and community based youth work contributes towards young people being able to develop their literacy and numeracy skills, which are not solely developed in the classroom. In combination, Youth Scotland's awards allow young people's nonformal achievements to be recognised in a meaningful way—particularly as they share the same SCQF levelling as formal qualifications.

Congratulations Graduates!

Many congratulations to The Boys' Brigade's 2016-17 KGVI course which graduated at a special service and ceremony in Airdrie on Saturday 24th March 2018. The KGVI cadets received their certificates from Superintendent Gavin Russell from Police Scotland, who is a former member of the 2nd Airdrie Company.

The King George VI (KGVI) Youth Leadership course is a residential training experience open to BB members aged 17-22. KGVI is endorsed by the CLD Standards



Council and has been levelled and credit-rated on SCQF, recognised at level 7 with 13 credit points.

Alex McLean, young leader with 5th Hamilton, was one of the twenty young people to graduate from the 16/17 course. He said: "KGVI has given me lots of skills that have helped me in both BB and in life... It also helped me to come out of my shell and build good relationships with the other young people."

Euan Walker, young leader with 7th East Kilbride, added: "KGVI has helped me step outside my comfort zone. I have volunteered for any opportunity I can to help improve my confidence and life experience."
